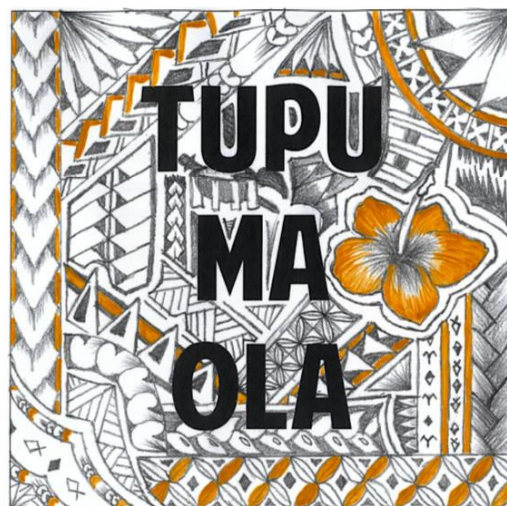

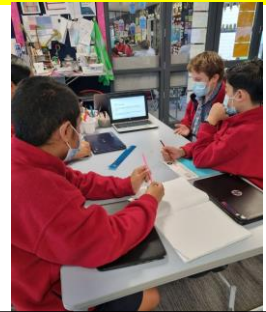

# Showcasing Team Waitākere

We enjoyed starting Term 2 with our learning around the moon phases and maramataka. We are currently publishing our explanations and diagrams on how the moon phases occur. Last week finally saw the start of student coaching. Once a week, our math coaches run workshops for other students to attend. The coaches all did a great job at planning and resourcing their sessions, and then running them. Students who attended the workshops demonstrated great R2P2 values and are looking forward to more student to student coaching next week.



We focused on building a sense of 'Turangawaewae' and developing a positive and trusting culture of learning. We have been discovering more about each other and strengthening relationships through collaborative learning and working as a team; establishing a vibrant and welcoming learning environment, where identity and diversity is embraced, celebrated and valued. Room 19's classroom is looking 'tino atahua' with their mahi proudly displayed. Their 'Kindness Kete' wall is a favourite spot, where learners acknowledge each other for genuine acts of kindness. The hand-woven harakeke and paper kete were made to post kindness messages and store our R2P2 cards. This involved lots of problem solving, perseverance and reciprocity.

We have been working hard on unpacking algebra and have been finding exciting ways to engage with our learning. Throughout the term so far we have begun to take an interest in looking after our physical health and, when the weather permits, making sure we do a daily run around the field. We have also adapted back amazingly into our school routine displaying our school values in everything we do.
